What are badges?

You remember badges, don't you? Maybe you even earned some merit badges when you were a kid: perhaps a Scout or Guide badge, or a swimming badge? Well, badges didn't end with your childhood: they are being reborn as a leading-edge way to recognize learning in the content-rich learning environment that surrounds us now.

And you can earn cool badges at ETUG Spring Workshop 2014!

When you receive your registration package at ETUG this June, you'll see a handsome (a) identification badge, with the workshop logo, and your name. But you'll also see space at the bottom of the badge for 3 mini-badges (stickers). Once again at the ETUG workshop, you'll have a chance to try to earn these badges: Social Networker, Sharing Star, and Helpful Hero.

AND

- Meet and chat with 2 ETUG members who are new to you
 - Share your tips, best practices, Open Education Resources

OR

- Contribute at least 2 or more of the following:
 - share photos on the workshop and tag "etug"
 - ask a question or initiate a discussion at the workshop or in scope.bccampus.ca
 - write 6 or more tweets about the workshop with #etug
 - o contribute your blog URL for the ETUG Blogroll
 - write a blog post about ETUG or the ETUG workshop
 - o participate as an interviewee on ETUG106Radio

OR

Provide technical assistance

OR

 Volunteer in a leadership or supporting role for workshop activities such as the ETUG106Radio, Graphic recording of the keynote or workshop session sketch notes

How do you get your earned badge?



- Keep track of your contributions and participation in the ETUG Spring Workshop. Include both your online and your on-site activities!
- When you have met the criteria for a badge (or badges), look for an official ETUG Badge Issuer – the members of SCETUG or designates, wearing one of the green name badges as shown on the left
- 3. Peel and stick your badges on your ETUG nametag.
